WHAT YOU CAN DO

Provide
immunizations and
antibiotics. Measles,
malaria, pneumonia,
AIDS, and diarrheal
diseases are the leading
causes of death in
children under five.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Promote good nutrition, including encouraging breastfeeding. Children who are fed breast milk are stronger and less vulnerable to disease than those who are not.

9 million children under

the age of five die each year due to malnutrition, poor health care, and inadequate sanitation

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Prevent motherto-infant HIV transmission by encouraging the use of antiretroviral drugs and formula feeding.

40% of women

in developing countries do not use contraception

TIP FOR SUCCESS

FAMILY PLANNING

Be culturally sensitive to the community's beliefs surrounding family planning. By doing so, you will foster a good working relationship and better meet the needs of the community.

53 million unintended pregnancies

could be prevented through family planning

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Provide access to family planning

information and resources. Meeting this need could reduce the number of maternal deaths by nearly 30 percent.

WHAT YOU CAN DO 1 in 22 women

Provide birthing kits to health professionals. will die during pregnancy and

80% of maternal deaths could

be prevented with access to reproductive health services and trained health care workers

TIPS FOR SUCCESS

- Ensure sustainability by empowering the local community to take ownership of health training programs.
- Consult Rotarians who are trained in maternal and child health care, such as midwives, obstetricians, and gynecologists.
- Partner with outside organizations with expertise in maternal and child health.



- 2 specialized fistula wards
- Treatment and rehabilitation of 1,500 fistula patients
- Vocational training and micro credits

'Prevention is the Key'

- Introduction of quality assurance
- Training of health personnel
- Provision of medical equipment
- Reduction of maternal mortality by 60%
- Reduction of fetal mortality by 15%



Methodology of Quality Assurance



Quality of structure (condition of hospitals):


 equipment available, number of staff, water supply, power supply, hygienic conditions

Quality of process:

- trained and well functioning experienced personnel and professional performance
- training, evaluation of results, benchmarking

Quality of outcome:

 reduction of maternal and infant morbidity and mortality





Pilot and scaling up project

- 2005 2010: MG <u>Pilot project</u> (3 m. US\$)
 "Improvement of Maternal and Child Health" (Kano, Kaduna State)
 - → 10 rural hospitals
- 2012 2014: MG <u>Scaling up</u> (≈ 0.6 m. US\$)
 "Improvement of Maternal and Child Health"
 (FCT Abuja, Ondo, Kano and Kaduna states)
 - → 20 rural hospitals









Overall goal

- → inclusion in health system
- → best sustainability

2nd scaling up project
5 hospitals in Enugu State
Project start: July 1, 2013

Prepare the project well

- → Learn about MCH project activities on www.maternal-health.org
- → Get your club/district to do **needs assessment** of high MMR/FMR
- → Focus on 3+ hospitals in rural / underserved areas
- → Host partner and international partner design project plan
- → For budget seek co-funding







Implement the project in 2-4 years

- → Establish contact to a teaching hospital for supervision
- → Recruit **project staff on-site** (e.g. midwife)
- → Make the methodology available to all parties concerned
- → **Advocacy** is needed at state governments
- → Inclusion of model project into health system = **best sustainability**
